


NEW BOOKS

What does Beanstack do?

Beanstack is a app and website that allows you to track your reading by time or books, write reviews and participate in fun reading challenges. It's easy to use and similar to services like GoodReads but without some of the social media aspects. It also links with our library catalogue and will allow you to track books by scanning the ISBN barcode on the back.

Sign up to Beanstack for personalized reading recommendations sent every week to your inbox. You can also track your growing TBR (to be read) pile and reading progress. Stay tuned to join special reading challenges hosted by your library.



What Challenges can I join?

Preschool Families

We are launching Beanstack with our 1000 Books before Kindergarten challenge for preschool children and their families.

Kids and Teens

We have a 600 minute reading challenge for school aged kids and teens, this will help them get used to using Beanstack because we will be using it for our Summer Reading Club.



Adults we are getting started with a 10 to Try challenge, read a book from each of the categories on our website (under services) and track it in Beanstack to earn badges and win prizes.



How do I get started?

Beanstack can be accessed through our webpage under Services: Beanstack Challenges. Directly through their webpage https://carstairspublic.beanstack.org or by downloading the Beanstack app . Full instructions are on the next page to guide you through the set up process.

Click **Next** to add additional family members.

Register for our **Challenges.** Beanstack will automatically present the challenges that fits your age group. We will be adding new challenges so check back as we add more.

Begin tracking your reading and activities by clicking **Log Reading and Activities** on the top left of the page.

- Use the drop-down menu under your name to switch readers and log for a child's account.
- Beanstack will notify you by email if you've won a prize. Or, check earned badges in the challenge.
- Select the gear setting (top right of screen) to edit a reader's information, such as email.

App Version

Download the app from your favorite play store Open App, Touch **Find Your School or Library**. Type in "'Carstairs Public Library."

Touch Sign up!

Follow the prompts to enter a User Name, Email (optional) and Password

Follow the prompts to complete the Registration for you.

Touch **Add a Reader** for additional family members Touch **Discover** at the bottom of the screen to register for the reading challenges that matches your age.

Touch the + (**Plus sign**) to log reading. You can scan, search, or manually enter the title.

- Use **Choose reader** to log for others.
- Quick Log will log a book all at once.
- Use Start a Reading Session to track pages or minutes, or Log Past Reading.
- Log shows you books and activities you've recorded

You can Switch Readers by touching the initials at the top right of the app screen. You may also add a reader or edit your information from the Account screen.

The Beanstack Tracker App will sync with the web version. If you log on the app, it will also appear on the web version. Make sure you've registered for a challenge for your books to count!

The Beanstack mobile app is like a fitness tracker, but for reading. Easily see your reading "stats," track reading for multiple readers, receive logging reminders, and view your reading "streaks" and achievements. The Beanstack Tracker App will synch all of your programs. Log a book in the app, and it will add to your challenges automatically!

It sounds like a lot, doesn't it? Don't worry – if you read one book with your child per day, you can complete this challenge in less than three years. Reading to and with your children will help build their early literacy skills which will help to set them up for a bright and strong future. Do you think you can do it? We would love for you to try! Register today for this challenge on Beanstack. All you need to do is log the books you read (and yes, re-reading absolutely counts to the goal).










NEW BOOKS
