


# The Kingdom of Sweets by Erika Johansen




We have also added a Cricut Venture and a 3D printer to our library and you'll be able to take our courses to be certified to book time and use these maker tools to bring your creative vision to reality.





### **Facebook Events**






### **Seated Chair Update**




### The Twelve Topsy-Turvey, very Messy Days of Christmas by James Patterson


# The Future by Naomi Alderman




# The Bittlemores by Jann Arden

away..







### I can Help by Kelly Greenawalt




