

Are you the school library?

We are right beside Carstairs Elementary School but they have their own library and awesome librarian so we are able to just be the Carstairs Public Library open to all.

Printing? Faxing? Laminating? Scanning? Resumes?


We are able to help with all your computer needs and our photocopier is equipped to do scanning to email and faxing as well. We have resources to help with resume creation and you can access a computer for no charge


Printing costs 0.20/page for black and white printing Faxing costs \$2.00 per fax Laminating costs \$1.00 for a whole page or \$0.25 for a health care card size piece

Where can I use my card?

We are part of Parkland Regional Libraries this means you can use Didsbury, Olds, and Cremona libraries with no extra steps. By registering your card a melibraries.ca you can take your card to almost any public library in Alberta and use their physical books. On the next page we explain how to access even more digital resources through a new partnership with TRAC libraries.

At the top of our webpage you will see a tab called E-Library and this is where you will find access to all our digital collections. There's a lot to explore in this area and it's easy to get overwhelmed.

Online Resources: Libby & Cloud Library


Getting Started

Both of these resources they include digital books AND audiobooks. If you are brand new to our digital resources you can watch the video tutorial to get you started or click learn more to get more help. If you've used these before you can click visit resource to get started right away.





If you want to read or listen on your device both of these resources require you to download an app to get started. You want to look for Libby or CloudLibrary in your app store, both are free apps.





Something New

For those that have been using these apps for awhile there is a new option in Libby that will give you access to shared content from TRAC Libraries.

In Libby follow the steps to the left to add TRAC as an option to browse and borrow their digital collections.

Open Libby and tap on the icon at the bottom of the screen. Under 'Your Libraries' color! 'Add a Librarie'.




2. Search TRAC and tap when found.

 Tap Parkland Regional Library and Sign in with your Parkland Regional Library System card number and pin.




NEW BOOKS




BlueBird by Ciel Pierlot




