Director's ReportOctober 14 2022

New Programmer

We hired a new Programmer (Louis) and their start date was October 3rd. They have been a wonderful help so far, and they are full of new ideas. They have been able to take over much of Savannah's programming, including Anime Club, which is one of our most popular teen programs. Louis will be coming with us to our Culture Day celebration where we can connect with more of the community on October 15, and they will be running some Media Literacy Week programming near the end of October.

National Day for Truth and Reconciliation

National Day for Truth and Reconciliation was a large exercise in community and relationship development. Despite starting our search for speakers, artists and experts months previously, most of the people we connected with and booked came together in the last couple of weeks due to many conversations with different organizations and community partners throughout September. Putting together the events of this day would not have been possible without the connections we have built over the past year.

On September 29th we were incredibly fortunate and grateful to host Phyllis Rattlesnake and her colleague Marilyn Rowan at our screening of We Were Children. Phyllis is a Community Health Promoter from the Maskwacis Health Services, and she and Marilyn help to educate families about indigenous child rearing practices. Marilyn is a residential school survivor, and led us through a smudging exercise before the film, and gave some opening and closing remarks about the importance of reconciliation work. We also had April McCorquindale from the Camrose Primary Care Network and Laurie Jansen from the Camrose Family Resource Network on hand to provide mental health first aid for anyone triggered by the content of the film. 25 people attended the film, and excellent conversation followed.

This event was hosted in partnership with the Bailey Theatre, the Camrose Family Resource Network, and Camrose and District Support Services. We were also incredibly fortunate to be put in contact with Andrea Menard from the University of Alberta. Andrea is the Lead Educational Developer, Indigenizing Curricula and Pedagogies, and is new to Augustana. Andrea ended up serving in an unofficial advisory capacity for all of our NDTR events, and we look forward to partnering in future opportunities.



On September 30th, we hosted Jessica Sanderson-Barry, nêhiyaw-iskwêw, Cree Artist from Chakastaypasin Band, Owner of JShine Designs. Jessica ran a beading workshop and informal talk about her late grandmothers experience with the residential school system, how it impacted her family for generations, and how Jessica's hide-tanning journey has acted as a source of intergenerational healing for her and her community. We had 20 spaces available, and we had over 25 people squish themselves into the Irving room to listen to Jessica and try their hands at beading. Jessica donated her proceeds to a couple of charities that help those impacted by the residential school system.

We also started our weekly study group of going through the University of Alberta's MOOC, Indigenous Canada, but attendance has been slow.

Many of the people we initially contacted were already booked for the day, either with other speaking engagements, or because they were spending it in ceremony, with family, etc. Next year we will need to start booking earlier, and looking at booking events on days besides the 30th. We also intend to celebrate National Indigenous History Month in June and hire more indigenous speakers/creators/artists to share and celebrate their crafts and cultures.

Culture Days

Camrose Public Library is partnering with the Camrose Arts Society, the Bailey Theatre, and the Genealogy Club to celebrate Culture Days! Much of the past month has been spent planning, and on October 15th CPL will be at the Chuck MacLean Centre and the Kamifurano Gazebo to celebrate Canadian Culture. October is Canadian Library Month, so we will be giving away free library cards, there will be a library raffle, live entertainment, food trucks, and open house at the Chuck MacLean, and the Genealogy Club will be hosting a free workshop for the public at the library.

Culture Days

On October 18 we will be hosting a legal clinic in partnership with Community Legal Clinic – Central Alberta, and Family and Community Support Services. The clinic will be discussing issues surrounding Family Law. There will also be a Temporary Photo ID clinic, where anyone can get a free temporary photo ID made, and then a lawyer will be available for 1-on-1 legal help, completely free. The Community Legal Clinic offers free legal help to those who qualify. If



this is well attended, we may be able to offer more legal clinics in the future about topics such as tenancy law, and estate planning.

Camrose Helps

We are still handing out surveys and QR codes for the community needs assessment from Camrose Helps. Community conversations will be taking place at the library on October 27th at noon and five.

September Program Summary



We returned to regular programming on September 6. We have seen an uptick in kids visiting afterschool and have provided snacks for an average of 22 kids every school day in September.
