c. Facility Options

A report and presentation will be created for the CPL Board and City Council to discuss options for CPL facilities, including renovations to the current CPL building, and a proposal for a Satellite Branch. Director's Report

June 14 2022

Bikes

Our bikes went in for service, and got all tuned up. Unfortunately, the Life Cycle got a tricky diagnosis, meaning it is out of commission until we can get it fixed. At the moment, the brake system is not working in tandem, meaning anytime someone brakes the bike pulls very hard to the right. Given that we want the community to use the bike, we cannot have it behaving in an unexpected and therefore dangerous way. The complicated part is that the system is European, and supply chain issues are complicating how we get it fixed.

Summer Students

Our Book Bike Pilots have started, and have already been busy out in the community. Make sure you stop to say hello at the Farmer's Market, and let any families you know, know about our Summer Reading Program Kick-Off event.

Staff Appreciation

Our staff appreciation night was held at Fox & Fable this year. The staff had a great time competing at Trivia, visiting, and eating tasty food. The Service Awards were distributed, and the winners of our new annual Staff Awards were announced. Our annual awards are Team Member of the Year, Customer Service Superstar, and Biggest Cheerleader, and they are staff nominated. Our newly hired Summer Staff got to meet the whole team and participate in some team building.

Hiring

CPL had a few staff members leave in May, so we brought on some wonderful new teammates to fill the gaps. We now have a new Circulation Assistant, and two new On-Call Circulation Assistants. We have been working on new training and on-boarding materials to help standardize the process.

Occupational Health and Safety

CPL has been working hard getting our OHS up to date. As part of this initiative, we sent ten staff members to get First Aid certified this month to make CPL a safer place to be. Additionally, we brought in a CANbike Instructor to give the Book Bike pilots a day of training to help them be aware and be safer while on the road.



Display Contest

Our team worked very hard to turn our library into a full building display for the month of April for Parkland's display contest. I'm proud to say that we took home second place. Carstairs came in first, and Hughenden came in third. You can see photos and video of our work on our social media pages.

Canada Day

The Camrose Public Library will be a sponsor for Canada Day 2022. Our Book Bike will be in attendance at the celebration, some of our large games will be set up on the grounds, and we have created a post card hand out with fun games, book lists, trivia, and plenty of information about all the services that CPL offers. 2500 of these were printed and will be distributed at the event grounds on Canada Day, similar to what was done last year.

CSL

We met with Augustana's Community Service Learning lead to discuss possible CSL placements for the fall and winter of next year, and we were able to come up with plenty of ideas. Hopefully everything works out and we will be seeing more CSL students in September.

Young Canada Works

We just received word that our waitlisted YCW application was approved for the full amount we applied for, which covers three positions. This grant will allow us to reach more people, provide more services, and help to build community in Camrose at a point where it is very much needed.

Fundraisers

The Fellowship of the Camrose Public Library have been working hard this month. In May they ran the Spring 2022 Fundraiser: Help Flood our Library's Shelves with Books! Patrons can sponsor a book in our collection, and dedicate a book to whomever they choose via a nameplate. To date we have had 24 books sponsored. This fundraiser will end June 30.

Chase the Ace chose Camrose Public Library to be the beneficiary of their raffle, and the Fellowship of the Camrose Public Library stepped up to be the official partner organization. Chase the Ace is an on-going raffle that supports community projects. From June 1 to June 15th, the proceeds from the raffle will be supporting CPL, helping us to purchase a self-checkout so we can spend more time helping our patrons and answering questions. CPL will receive \$20 of the bi-weekly jackpot. As of today, the bi-weekly jackpot is estimated at \$1,850,



which translates into ~370 for CPL. This fundraiser ends at 5:00pm Wednesday, June 15th.

Dolly Parton's Imagination Library

Rotary had a very successful ReBoot fundraiser on May 13, where the DPIL was one of a few recipients. We have filled our 200 available spots, although as children age out of the program, we have new spots open so we do keep a wait list. We are hopeful that we will either be able to expand or extend our DPIL commitment, which is currently 200 seats for 3 years.
