ADP Workforce Now & COLA

Over the past few months, we've been ironing out the kinks in and learning the ins-and-outs of our new payroll and HR software. We officially transferred from implementation to service this month, which is cause for celebration. We also successfully adjusted the staff's pay rates based on the 2.5% Cost-of-Living Adjustment and paid them their retropay to January using WFN. The staff would like to pass along their sincere thanks to the Board for approving the COLA!

Lower-Level Renovations & Inventory

The downstairs painting is finished, and our call for artists to paint a mural in our children's space had 13 responses! We're very excited to select an artist and see that vision come to life. Since the renovations were complete, we also had Parkland come to finish our collection inventory downstairs.

Canada Day

Look for the Book Bike and our activity postcards at the Canada Day celebrations! The summer students have also created an app-based scavenger hunt centred around Camrose history and locations that starts before Canada Day and will continue afterward. We're also happy to have confirmed Mr. Brad Rabbit's attendance, funded by CPL, as an Indigenous greeter and entertainer for the opening ceremonies.

Culture Days

Our joint application with City of Camrose Arts & Recreation and the Bailey Theatre received almost all our requested funding, and Camrose will be an Alberta Culture Days feature city. CPL will host at least two workshops—a family tree one in partnership with the Genealogy Society, and an Orange Shirt beading workshop—and attend a number of outreach events throughout the month of September.
