

Seasonal or Temporary Supervisor Policy

1. Purpose

This policy outlines when a temporary or Seasonal Supervisor will be designated, who may be assigned, their responsibilities, and compensation for additional duties.

2. Definitions

- 2.1 Seasonal Supervisor: A staff member designated to assume supervisory duties for a designated period of time. For this policy, the terms “seasonal” and “temporary” may be used interchangeably.
- 2.2 Report: The temporary or seasonal staff member who will report to the Seasonal Supervisor

3. Conditions

- 3.1 A Seasonal Supervisor will be designated when:
 - 3.1.1 Temporary employee(s) are hired for a seasonal or short-term project, and
 - 3.1.2 The employee(s) are not under the direct supervision of someone whose regular job includes supervision, and
 - 3.1.3 The designated employee must assume supervisory duties outside their standard job description.

4. Appointment

- 4.1 The Library Director or designate will assign a temporary/seasonal supervisor on a case-by-case basis.
 - 4.1.1 Experience, suitability, employee development, and scheduling will be factors considered when assigning supervisory duties.
- 4.2 The employee offered the role may accept or refuse.
- 4.3 If the seasonal supervisor is away temporarily (e.g., vacation) their supervisor, the library director, or an interim temporary supervisor will assume responsibilities.



5. Responsibilities

- 5.1 The Seasonal Supervisor will assume responsibilities including:
 - 5.1.1 Training and coaching their report(s),
 - 5.1.2 Scheduling and conduct regular check-ins,
 - 5.1.3 Oversee performance,
 - 5.1.4 Troubleshoot concerns and scheduling issues,
 - 5.1.5 Verify their report's timesheets,
 - 5.1.6 Other responsibilities as needed.
- 5.2 When unsure, the Seasonal Supervisor will consult their supervisor or the Library Director.

6. Compensation

- 6.1 The Seasonal Supervisor will receive a premium of \$1 per hour for each hour worked during their tenure.
