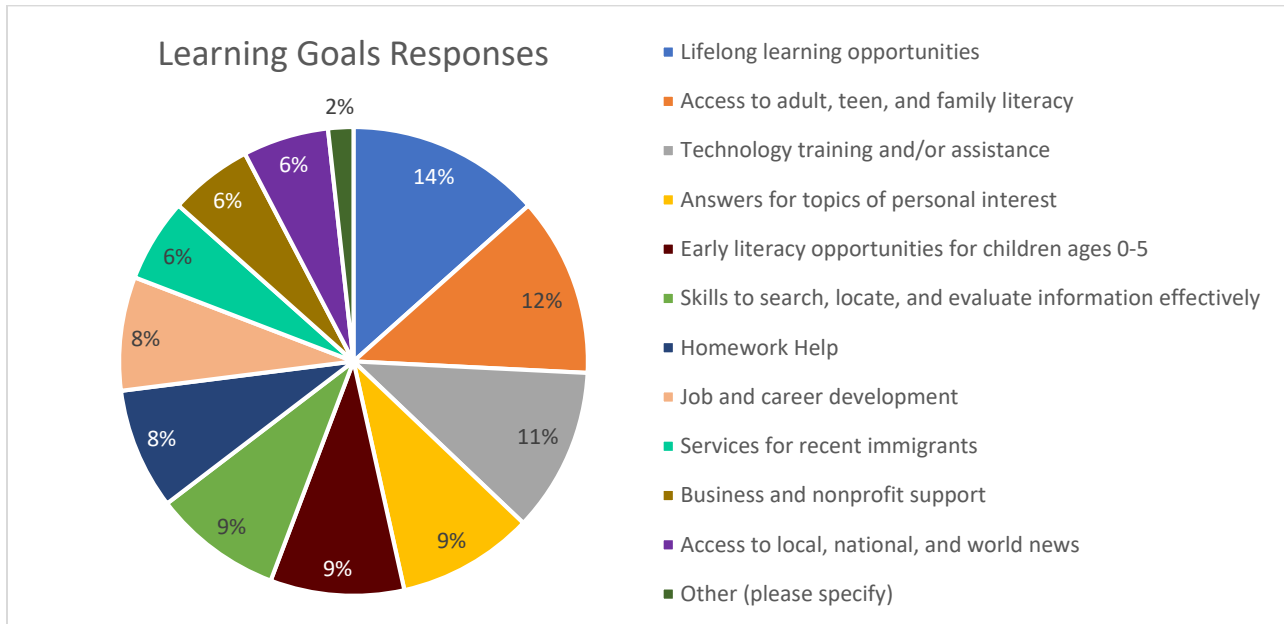

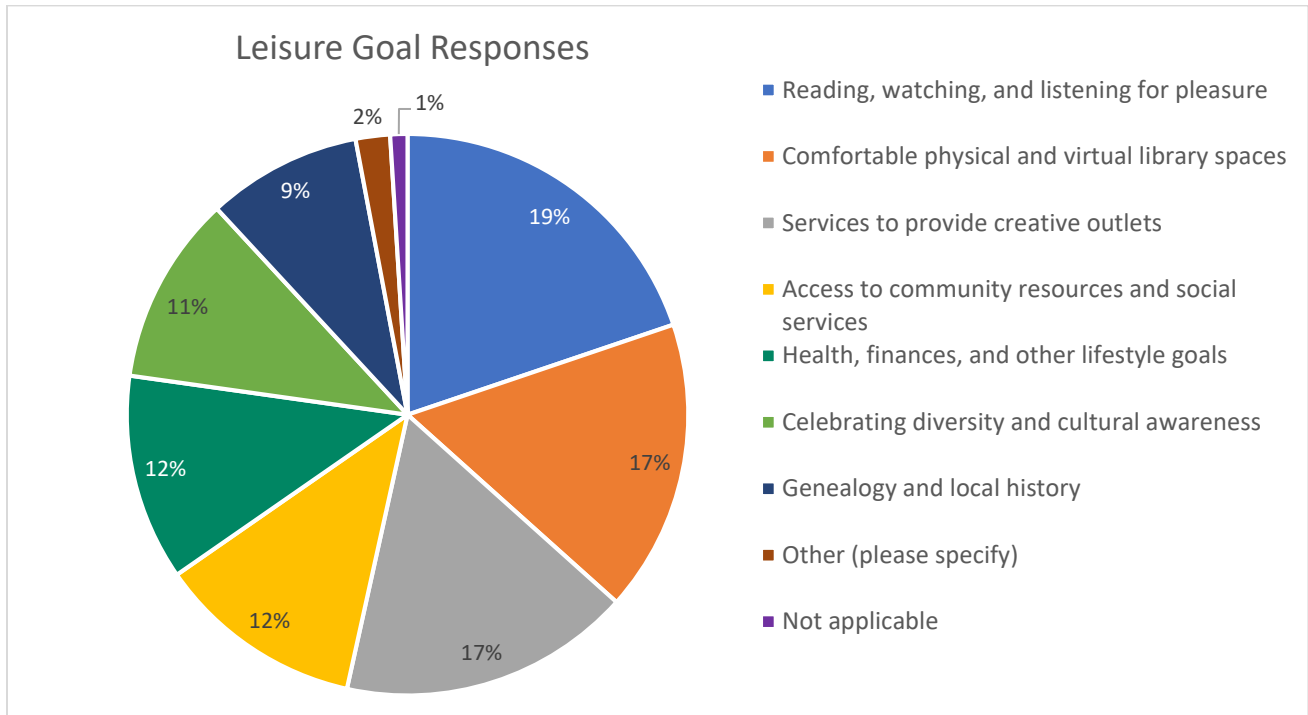

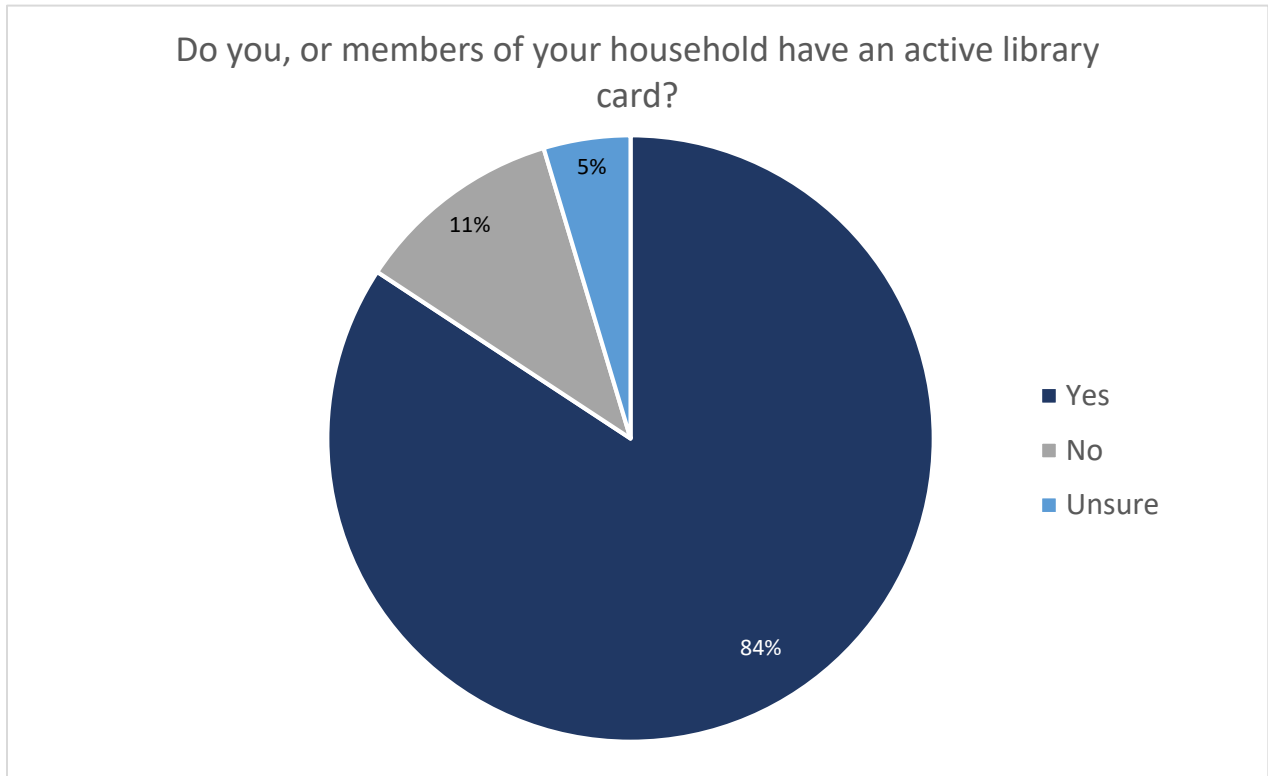

Question 5: Do you, or members of your household have an active library card?



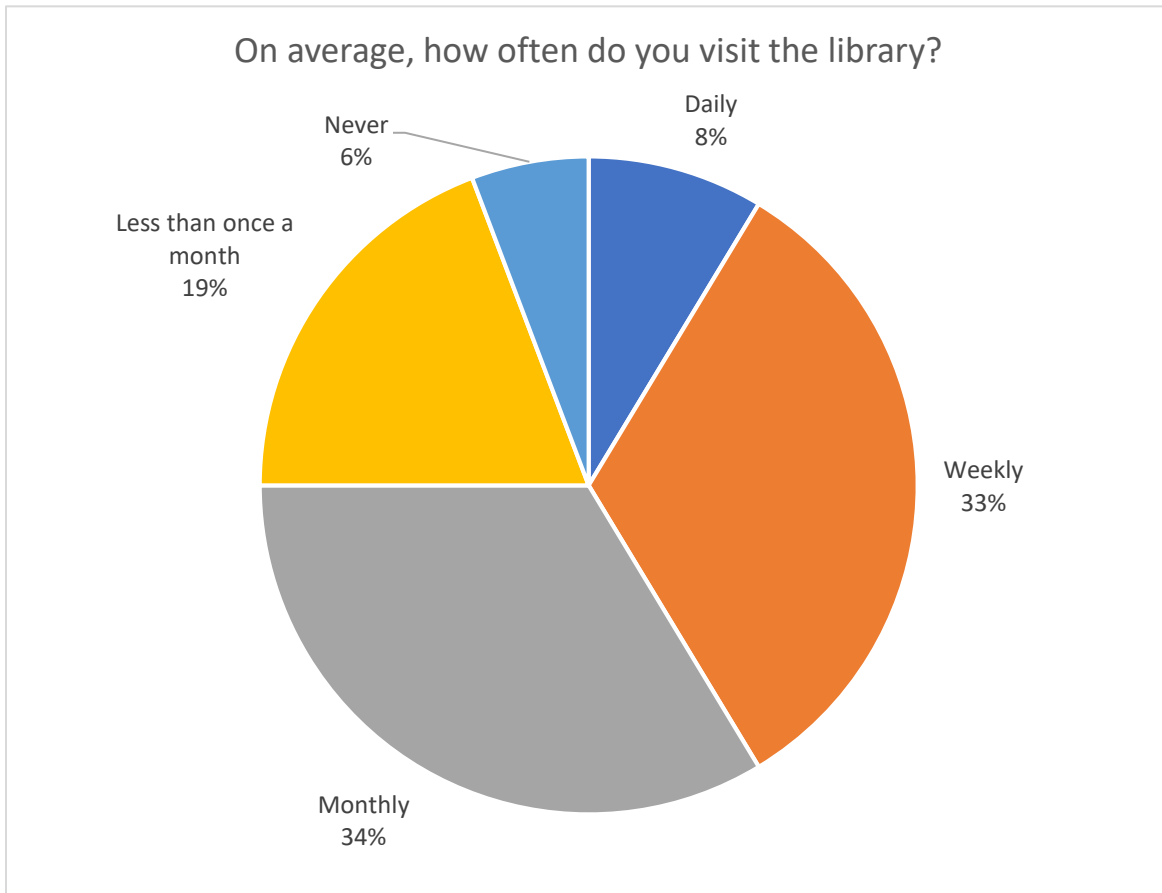

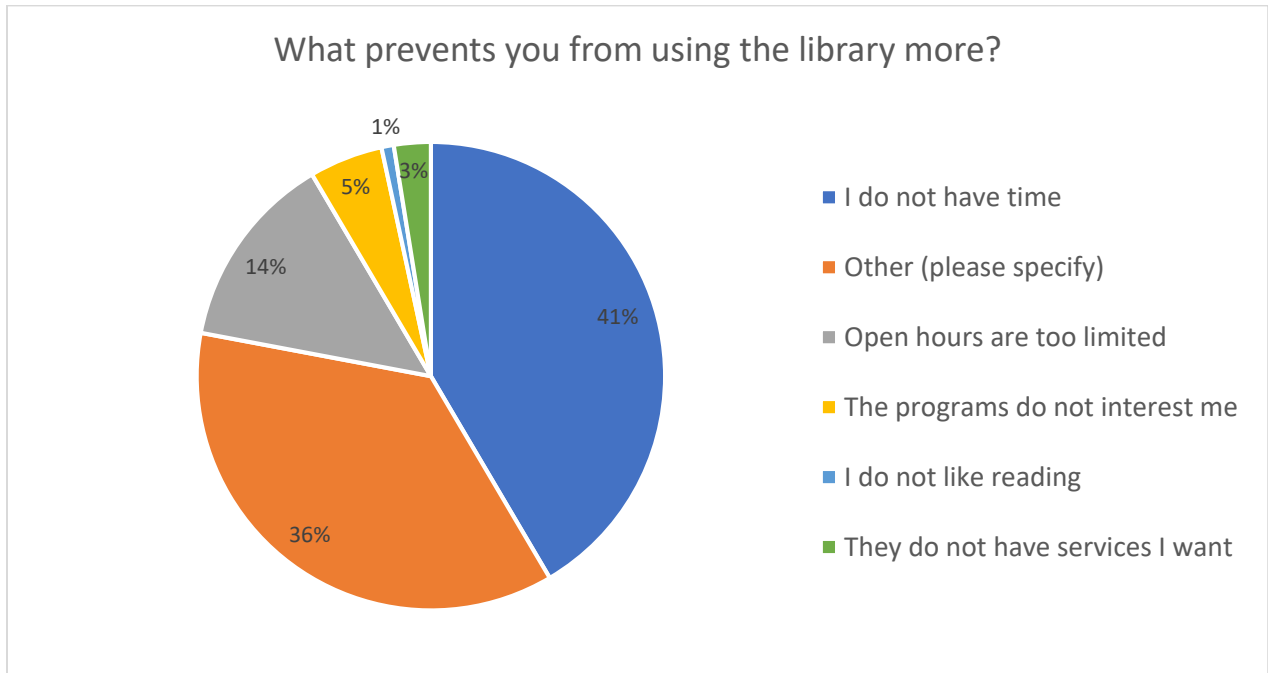

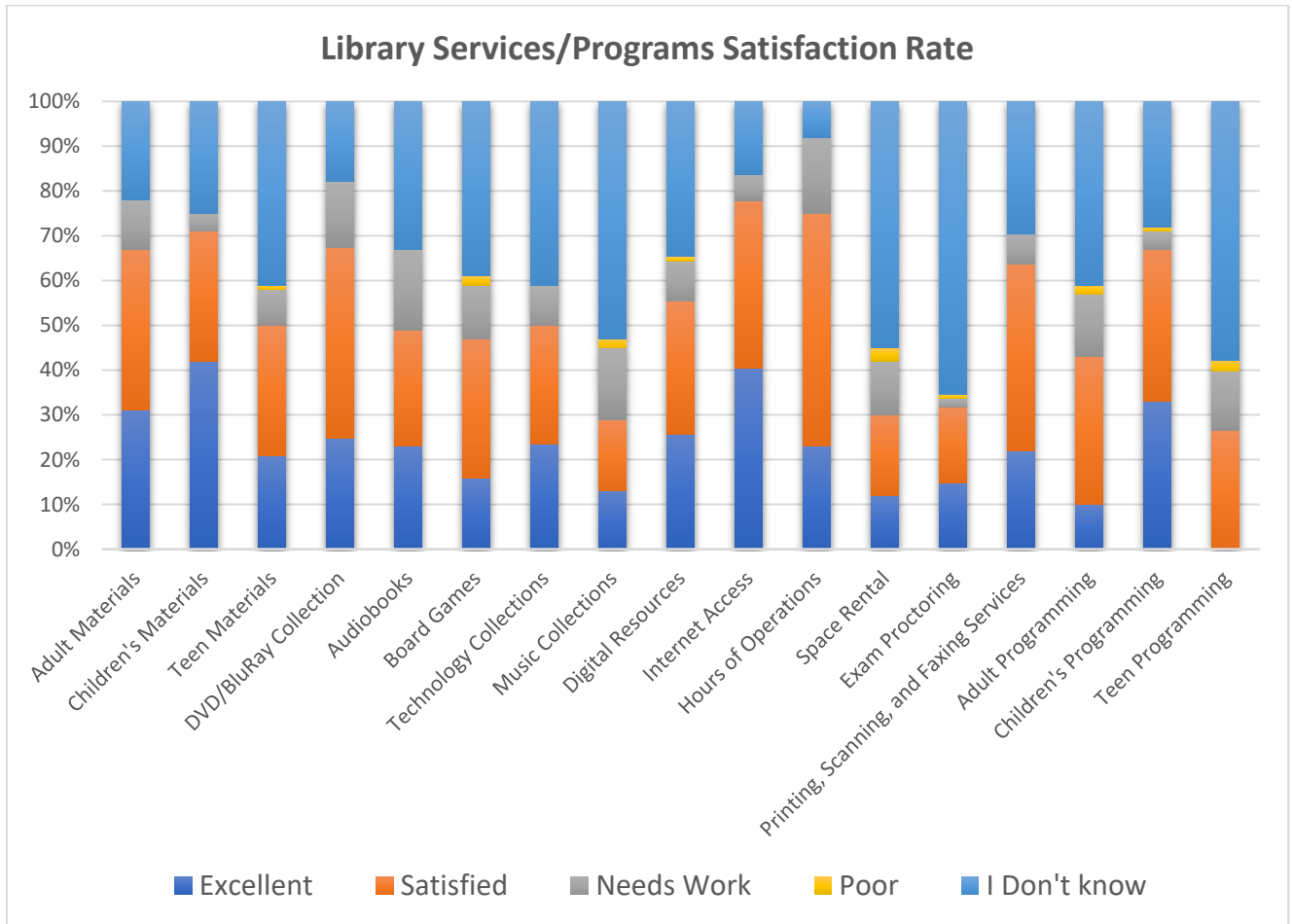
