2.0 Finance

- 2.1 Financial Report for February 2023 (D. Galway)
 - 2.1.1 Presentation of Financial Report for February 2023
 - 2.1.2 Most expenses and incomes are at expected levels for the time of year
 - 2.1.3 Membership fees expenses are higher than proportional due to billing schedules and are expected to remain in budget for the year
 - 2.1.4 Programming costs are higher than proportional but are front loaded and are expected to remain in budget for the year
 - 2.1.5 Materials costs for the 1000BBK program are higher than expected
 - 2.1.6 Copier lease is coming to an end soon and D. Galway will be connected with vendor for options to report back to board
 - 2.1.7 Staff appreciation for February higher than usual due to staff birthdays

- 2.2 PLSB Skill Development Grant
 - 2.2.1 Ponoka Jubilee Library has been awarded a \$10,000 Skills Development for Rural Alberta Grant by Municipal Affairs
 - 2.2.2 Resume and cover letter writing, job interview preparation, resume printing as well as professional clothing lending are the deliverables
 - 2.2.3 The grant will cover significant training and supply costs
 - 2.2.4 Prep and training starts in June with program delivery to run September through November

2.3 2023 Budget Amendment Discussion

- 2.3.1 The Government of Alberta has increased funding to libraries and changed the funding model which effectively increases the PJL Municipal Affairs grant amount by \$11,892 for a total of \$49,482 per year
- 2.3.2 County of Ponoka has increased their operations grant by \$3000 for a total of \$63,000 per year
- 2.3.3 Budget increases in the form of provincial, county and projected rural services grant increases will allow a return to periodical and book purchases as well an increase in programming costs while allowing for a surplus
- 2.3.4 Service hours will remain as they are
- 2.3.5 J. Ramage to ask PRL about Rural Services Grant size and timing
- 2.3.6 D. Galway to provide a side by side of current and proposed budget for approval at April meeting

3.0 Librarian's Report

3.1 Statistics

3.1.1 Patronage, circulation, and social media interactions remain strong

3.2 Collections

- 3.2.1 Half of PRL collection allotment will be spent by end of March as per PRL guidelines
- 3.2.2 Collections allotment has been targeted to deficient areas including board books and young adult
- 3.2.3 Discussion of budget amendment wherein the suggestion is to increase periodical funding to \$1250 and direct book purchases to \$1000 per year
- 3.2.4 Review of reconsideration of library materials and harassment zero-tolerance policy; library manager reviews considerations and appeals can be brought to board

3.3 Operations

- 3.3.1 New donation boxes have been installed in a secure way to prevent theft
- 3.3.2 Town of Ponoka has ordered and will be installing a replacement book drop box to replace the existing drop which leaks and doesn't work well
- 3.3.3 Collaboration has begun with Ponoka Secondary Campus to create a long term collection to be on loan onsite and to build a student membership process
- 3.3.4 New employee has been trained on ILS, library processes and procedures and is prepping for seed library launch in April
- 3.3.5 Ponoka Chamber of Commerce has reached out to see if Library is interested in a table at the upcoming Trade Show
 - 3.3.5.1 Staffing costs and lack of marketing return on investment will prevent library participation; D. Galway to reply
- 3.3.6 Lobby is currently displaying the work of local artist Edith Kane

3.4 Programming

- 3.4.1 Combined programming engagement for the month of February of 821 patrons across 13 programs in 34 scheduled times
- 3.4.2 Programming costs are within budget and are expected to remain so
- 3.4.3 383 patron connections with 1000 Books Before Kindergarten
- 3.4.4 127 patron connections with Hickory Dickory Tot's Neighborhood Place collaboration for the month of February
- 3.4.5 70 patron connections with Fairy Tale Picnic

3.5 Outreach

- 3.5.1 Outreach to Seasons, Rimoka, Centennial Centre, Northcott, Ponoka Hospital and residential shut-ins servicing 54 patrons for the month of February
- 3.5.2 Liaisons exist at all outreach centers to assist with tracking and locating materials
- 3.5.3 Most outreach patrons will be moved to PJL only materials to prevent lost material costs for interlibrary loans
 - 3.5.3.1 Exceptions will be made for outreach patrons who have families that actively access the PJL library
- 3.5.4 Considering billing institutions for missing/lost materials; new procedures to be designed for September implementation
